Stephen G. Pophal, MD is the Medical Director of Inpatient Cardiology of the Pediatric Heart Transplant Program at Phoenix Children's Hospital. Before joining PCH he was the Chief of Pediatric Cardiology and Medical Director of the Scott and Laura Eller Congenital Heart Center, a subdivision of the Heart & Lung Institute at St. Joseph's Hospital and Medical Center.

Dr. Pophal received his undergraduate degree in Mechanical Engineering from The University of Notre Dame and his medical degree from The Ohio State University College of Medicine. He completed his pediatric residency at the University of Chicago and a fellowship in pediatric cardiology at the Children's Hospital of Pittsburgh. He then served as assistant professor of pediatrics, Department of Pediatric Cardiology at Rush Presbyterian St. Luke's Medical Center and Northwestern University's Feinberg School of Medicine in Chicago. He served as associate director of the pediatric cardiac catheterization lab, pediatric heart transplant program, and director of heart failure and cardiomyopathy services at Northwestern's Children's Memorial Hospital. He also directed the pediatric residency education program at Children's Memorial.

Dr. Pophal is a fellow of the American College of Cardiology, and is a member of the American Academy of Pediatrics and the International Society of Heart and Lung Transplantation. Dr. Pophal has published numerous articles on pediatric cardiac interventional procedures and transplantation. He is board certified in pediatrics and pediatric cardiology.
